Swaziland Coat of Arms depicts symbols of Swaziland culture. The lion represents the King; the elephant, the Queen Mother - both support a Nguni shield, symbolising 'protection'. Above the shield you can see the lidlabe, the crown of feathers worn during the Incwala ceremony, our festival of the first fruit.
